BURDENS OF LIFE

Gal. 6:2-5; Psa. 55:22

INTRODUCTION:

- A. Fate of all men to have burdens 2Cor. 5:4
- B. Burdens are not always visible consequently we need restraint and charity in our judgments of others
- C. Lets examine the two concepts or two burdens listed in Gal. 6:2, 5 and also one found in Psa 55:22, 1Pet. 5:7

DISCUSSION:

- I. SELF ASSISTANCE (Every man shall bear his own burden) Gal. 6:5
 - A. Some burdens are non-transferable
 - B. The word Burden in this' verse is from the Greek word PHORTION which means pack - something to be borne, without reference to its weight - Mat 11:30 Burden (portion) of Christ is light
 - C. Each individual has his own responsibility or work
 - 1. No one can obey the gospel for you 2Thess 1:8
 - 2. No one can do what you are able to do as a Christian for you Matt 25
 - 3. No one can answer for you at the judgment 2Cor 5:10; Rom 14:12
 - D. It is foolish for one to try to get lost in the crowd and hide behind others to avoid his own burdens Heb 4:13

II. MUTUAL ASSISTANCE (Bear ye one another's burdens) Gal. 6:2

- A. Some burdens are to be shared with others Phil. 2:4
- B. Burden here from (Baros) denotes a weight anything pressing on one physically or that Makes a demand on one's resources whether physical or spiritual
- C. The key to verse 2 is in verse 1
 - 1. We should seek to help or restore those who have gone astray not denounce or try to keep them down
 - 2. Restore to set in joint again as a doctor would a dislocated bone
- D. In what spirit meekness (not in wrath but gentle)
 - 1. Many reproofs lose their effectiveness when given in the wrong spirit
 - 2. When given with loving concern with the proper attitude they will help bear the burden

- E. This burden also includes other types of burdens
 - 1. Burden of sorrow Rom 12:15; 1Cor 12:26
 - a. visit them, help them when we can
 - b. Can't take their burden (stand in their place) but we can show them our interest in their sorrow
 - 2. Need for material things Jas 1:27; 2:15,16
 - a. Must show interest here also James 2 is talking to the same individual as James 1
 - b. Opportunity and ability governs our Responsibility
 - Burden of sin (bond servant Rom 6:17 Weight Heb 12:1)
 - a. teaching 2Tim 2:2; Matt 28:19, 20
 - b. Warning the unruly 1Thess 5:14
 - c. Pray for the lost Matt 5:44
 - 4. Burden of leadership
 - a. Elders Heb 13:17
 - b. Preachers Eph 6:18-20
 - c. Civil rulers 1Tim 2:1,2
- III. DIVINE ASSISTANCE (Cast thy burden upon the Lord) Psa 55:22; 1Pet 5:7
 - A. Some burdens are beyond the reach of human effort
 - B. Not my will but thine be done Matt 26:39
 - C. God will either take away the burden or He will give us strength to bear it 2Cor 12:7-10; 1Cor. 10:13
 - D. So with unbearable burdens we should cast them upon the Lord 1Pet 5:7; Phil. 4:5-7
- CONCLUSION:
 - A. Let's be willing to assume our own burdens (pack of responsibility) **self-assistance**
 - B. Let 's become conscious of the burdens of others "We are our brother's keeper" **mutual assistance**
 - C. Take burdens we can't handle to the Lord (disappointments, fear of failure and sin) **divine assistance**
 - D. Someday we'll lay all our burdens down
 - E. That's why Jesus said "come unto me---- Matt 11:28-30
