CALLED TO BE SAINTS

Rom 1:1-7

INTRODUCTION:

- A. There is a great deal of misunderstanding today in regard to who is a saint,
- B. Look at this from the standpoint of finding out Just who is a saint and then give encouragement to those who are
- C. As we will see in the lesson, being a saint implies a certain type of conduct

DISCUSSION:

I. JUST WHAT IS A SAINT?

- A. There is confusion among men in answer to the question
 - Some Bibles title New Testament books: St Matthew; St John; St Paul and St Peter, while other texts leave off the title of "St."
 - 2. Catholic cannon of saints such as St, George, Joan of Arc. Patrick, Valentine and many others
 - a. Persons who supposedly have had some miraculous powers and have been dead for a period of time
 - b. Upon proper recommendations the Pope Beatifies, then canonizes the person
 - c. There will probably be a canonization of "Mother Teresa" following her recent death
 - 3. In our society "sainthood" is a human religious concept; a commendation extended by man, exalting one person over another
 - 4. Then there are average people who say "I am no saint, but I do this or that good deed" etc.
- B. How does the Bible use the term "saint"
 - The New Testament concept is quite different, it is not a status reserved for a few, but a way of life available to all who are willing to obey God and live as He directs
 - 2. Solomon used the term to apply to all God's people at the dedication of the Temple 2Chron 6:41
 - 3. In the Psalms, David calls on saints to: Fear God 34:9; Love God 31:23; Sing to God 30:4; Shout for Joy 132:9
 - Salutations of Paul in Rom 1:7; 1Cor 1:2; 2Cor 1:1; Eph 1:1; Phil 1:1 and Col 1:2 all contain the word "saints", applying the term to all those addressed Note also its usage in Acts 9:13,32,41; 26:10
 - 5. The Holy Spirit makes intercession for saints Rom 8:27 (Note: there is nothing said about saints interceding with God for man)
 - 6. Christians are to minister to the needs of saints Rom 12:13; 1Tim 5:10

- 7. When Paul brought funds for relief of the hungering in Judea, he called them saints Rom 15 26-31
- 8. All of God's people are called saints in the Bible
- C. What is the meaning of the word itself?
 - 1. In the Greek "hagios" used over 200 times in noun and adjective forms and means holy or holy one
 - 2. In Vincent's word studies he says the root idea is "charity, freedom from admixture of evil" Vol.1p.587
 - 3. All God's people are to be "chaste" (pure) 2Cor 11:2; 1Pet 3:2 and "free from evil" 1Thess 5:22
 - 4. We conclude again that all God's children are regarded as saints we are sanctified or set apart
- D. It doesn't mean a trouble-free life Acts 9:13; 26:10
- E. It doesn't mean you will never be in need Rom 12:13; 15:25,26; 2Cor 9:1,12

II. THE CONDUCT BECOMING SAINTS Eph 5:3

- A. Those who have been cleansed of sins and dedicated to Christ should act like it.
- B. This includes abstinence from sins such as: fornication, uncleanness, covetousness and foul talk Eph 5 3-6; Note also Gal 5:19-21
- C. This includes positive, active goodness as well
 - 1. "Let the redeemed of the Lord say so" Psa 107:2
 - 2. "Tell what great things the Lord hath done for thee" Mk 5:19
 - 3. See your good works & glorify the Father Matt 5:16
 - 4. Husband won by "chaste conversation" 1Pet 3:1,2

III. THE BLESSINGS OF THE SAINTS

- A. The intercession of the Holy Spirit in problems and needs Rom 8:27
- B. Fellow citizens and part of the household of God Eph 2:19;
- C. Heirs of God Eph 1:18; Col 1:12; Rom 8:17

IV. WE ARE CALLED TO BE SAINTS BY THE GOSPEL 2Thess 2:14

- A. Involves obedience to the Gospel of Christ Rom 1:16; 2Thess 1:8 (faith, repentance, confession and baptism)
- B. Thereby added to the Lord's church, the sanctified or called out body Acts 2:47
- C. Those added are expected to act in accordance with what the name suggest .

CONCLUSION:

- A. Christ is coming to be glorified by his saints and to glorify them 2Thess 1:7-10
- B. Are you a saint; have you been sanctified by the blood of Christ?
- C. You can't afford to not be in that number!
