## "WHEN I FALL, I SHALL RISE" OR NEVER GIVE UP

Micah 7:8

#### INTRODUCTION:

- A. What greater resolution could one make than, "Though I fall, I will rise (New ASV)
- B. Possibly a more popular resolution is: "I will not fall; I will be perfect." But one finds himself falling anyway see Rom 3:23 and 1Jhn 1:8,10
- C. However, he will not fail as long as he rises immediately when he stumbles. This is a race in which all the runners sometimes stumble, but a fall does not disqualify a runner if he immediately rises
- D. A comparison with Prov 24:16 might be helpful
- E. These are the considerations to be discussed in this lesson

### DISCUSSION:

#### I. EVERY CHRISTIAN SHOULD TRY NOT TO FALL

- A. He should be like a boxer, seeking strength, trying to stand, withstanding the blows of the enemy
- B. Scriptures warn against falling 1Pet 5:8; Heb 3:12; 1Cor 10:12
- C. Other scriptures tell us how to avoid falling 2Pet 1:5-11; Eph 6:10-17

## II. GOOD MEN AND WOMEN DO SOMETIMES FALL

- A. The possibility of their doing so is expressed in Gal 6:1; 1Jhn 2:1
- B. Great characters of the Bible did fall into sin.
  - 1. Noah got drunk Gen 9:20,21
  - 2. Abraham told a lie Gen 20:1-5
  - 3. Moses added to God's command Num 20:7-11
  - 4. David committed adultery and murder 2Sam 11:2-5
  - 5. Peter denied Christ Matt 26:69-75

# III. THE PERSON WHO FALLS DETERMINES WHETHER OR NOT THE ENEMY REJOICES

- A. If the person stays down, the enemy will rejoice much as a boxer gloats over a fallen opponent
- B. However, if he rises from his fall, repents, confesses, and calls upon God for forgiveness, the enemy will find no joy
- C. Some over whom the enemy could rejoice
  - 1. King Saul failed to rise; he stayed down till he fell on his own spear 1Sam 13:11-13; 31:6
  - 2. Judas failed to rise, he stayed down till he hanged himself. Can't you just imagine the devil saying "Ah ha, I got one of His apostles" Matt 26:15,16; 46-49

- D. Some over whom the enemy could not rejoice
  - David: the devil's elation must have been great when David committed adultery, then murder. But David rose from his fall. Note his attitude upon hearing from God's prophet, Nathan 2Sam 12:7,13; then note his prayer in Psa 51:1-12
  - 2. Peter had a shameful fall: Can't you just hear the devil saying "I got that impetuous apostle." But Peter rose up from his fall, he wept bitterly Matt 26:75
- E. Some present day applications
  - 1. Many now have fallen and Satan is rejoicing
    - a. Individuals have been taught and baptized then Satan went to work and is now boasting
    - b. many have fallen by the wayside and have not come up fighting.
  - 2. Some are still fighting, but have not been able to get up yet, they need help from others to win the fight
  - 3. Satan can't rejoice against any child of God who hates his sins, confesses them, and prays for mercy Heb 4:15,16; 1Jhn 1:7-10

#### IV. THERE ARE REASONS WHY SOME DON'T RISE

- A. Some think that if they once fall, they are hypocrites
  - 1. This is not necessarily so
  - 2. Hypocrites are not sincere. They want to be deceived and act if they have not fallen
- B. Some simply become discouraged
  - 1. These say "I can never be a Christian; I just can't make it."
  - 2. They don't get up they give up!
  - 3. My grandfather used to say: "It's all right to give out, just don't ever give up."
  - 4. One can't make it through being perfect, but a person can make it through God's grace Heb 4:15,16; Psa 103:10-13

#### CONCLUSION:

- A. There will be no second chance, when death comes that's all there is of this life and our time to prepare
- B. Now is the time to get up and keep on fighting, and with God's help we can make it
- C. As often as one truly repents, they can get up and try again
- D. God and Christ paid a great price so you wouldn't have to give up so never give up, the strength and power available to you is greater than the strength and power against you.
